Table Tennis continues to thrive both on a weekly and bi-annual competition basis and now we have several ladders operating throughout the year

We were able to generate enough funds to carry out normal maintenance and a couple of small capital items viz gazebos

Our main expense was legal fees necessitated by the conversion from 1950's Trust Deed to a SCIO

This conversion was a major achievement

Even tho' we carried out a lot of the work ourselves as land and buildings were involved and antiquated trusts deeds, the cost was > £10, 000 over this year and last year

Since our refurb, we are fortunate that we are in a position that we can afford this sum. We consider it an essential part of future sustainability but would comment that the procedure is very complex and expensive and many charities with the same governance problems as us would not be able to afford to rectify them
